**STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS RELATING TO PLANTERS
AT GARDEN FLATS LANE, DUNNINGTON**

1. The Licensee shall keep the part of the structure to which this licence relates in a trim and tidy condition. The City of York Council, Highways, will serve notice to remedy any defect identified giving one month to make good such deficiencies notified in that defect notice. It is a condition of the grant of this licence that the licensee acknowledges that failure to rectify the notified defect within the period specified will automatically determine this licence and the structure together with any above ground works must then be removed within a period not exceeding one month from that determination. Failure to remove these works will result in the council undertaking the necessary works itself and recovering its costs from the former Licensee.
2. The Licensee is responsible for all reinstatement works.
3. The Licensee is responsible for the repair of any damage to the highway however caused by the structure. If the City of York Council has to repair the highway as a result of damage caused by the structure they will recover costs from the Licensee.
4. The Licensee must indemnify the City of York Council against all claims, costs, charges or actions that arise out of the presence of the structure on the highway.
